For every 100 prescriptions written:


○ 50-70 are filled at the pharmacy

48-66 are picked up from the pharmacy

• 25-30 are taken properly

• 15-20 are refilled as prescribed

50% of the 3.2 billion annual prescriptions dispensed in US are not taken as prescribed

125,000 deaths per year in the US are linked to medication non-adherence²



30-50% of patients are not adherent to their medicines in France¹


Approximately

8,000 deaths and \$ 1.1 million hospital days per year in France are linked to medication non-adherence³

There is a strong correlation between trust in health care providers and improved medication adherence


